#### To discover, see and do...

Located on the east coast of Hudson Bay, the Daniel-Weetaluktuk Museum is the only recognized museum in Nunavik. Devoted to preserving and disseminating the Inukjuamiut's culture, the Museum presents original artworks, archaeological pieces, artifacts clothing displayed in their cultural context explaining the way of life and the rich Inuit tradition. Built in 1992, the Museum was entirely renovated and reopened at the end of 2005. The new permanent exhibit Takunnatauninga ilirsusivut takunnagusitigut/ Our culture as we feel it, was made by members of the community through an experimental participative inventory followed by a creative design workshop. A sealskin qajaq (kayak) and the recreation of the inside of an igloo are major components of this exhibition.
